Subscriptions

It is the time of year where we are starting to think about Girlguiding annual subscriptions which are paid every year in February. The levee for 2025 subscriptions will be £62.00.

Please find the information for the breakdown of the 2025 member subscriptions below:

Girlguiding UK = £33 Girlguiding Cymru = £20 Girlguiding Central Glamorgan = £9

Please check with your local commissioner for any further details or if you have any questions regarding paying 2025 subscriptions.

Activities outside of the meeting place

This is a reminder of the ratios for each section away from the meeting place.

- Rainbows: 1 adult for every 5 children with a minimum of 2 adults.
- Brownies: 1 adult for every 8 children with a minimum of 2 adults.
- Guides: 1 adult for every 12 children with a minimum of 2 adults.
- Rangers: 1 leader with a recommended second adult.

Girlguiding's suggested adult-to-child ratios are flexible within the meeting place. However, the Girlguiding ratios are mandatory outside of the meeting place.

There should be a risk assessment in place, and you should inform your commissioner of your intent to carry out an activity outside of the unit meeting place.

Accounts



Reminder that the end of the year is 31 December 2024. It is the responsibility of all units to have their accounts checked – This is due to the charity commission and is a compliance requirement by Girlguiding. This can be done through the commissioner or the treasurer for your area.

You will need to provide the following:-

- Your record of accounts
- Your registers
- All receipts of purchase
- All income receipts
- All Bank statements for the year inclusive

Remember you cannot check your own accounts and if you are a signatory on an account you cannot check these either. Your commissioner will be in contact with you to organise this in your area.

Safe Space

Safety is at the heart of everything we do. Because we know that when girls feel safe, they feel brave enough to do things they never thought they could. The training is changing. There will from December be only one training for all members of Girlguiding no matter what your role. It will be available on the learning portal. If any level comes out of compliance you will now have to do the new Safe space learning. If you are in compliance you can continue in your role as it is. Please every unit needs at least one person with safe space level 3.

First Response/First Aid Qualification

Every unit needs a first aider. Please review your unit and ensure that at least one member has this qualification. To be compliant with first response you need to have completed the online elearning as well as attend first response or a recognised first aid qualification.

Changes to Leadership qualification

The following changes have come into action. Girlguiding has phased out the assistant leader roles, and how leaders change which section they volunteer with. Two new courses for volunteers who have qualified through the leadership qualification (LQ). The 'top-up' learning is for assistant leaders who've done module 1-3 of the LQ (Red Book) who want to move to a leader role and for existing leaders who want to refresh their Girlguiding knowledge. If you've qualified via the LQ and want to move sections, complete the 'moving sections' course. Both courses can be found in the leader development programme area on the learning platform.

Assistant leader transition

Existing assistant leaders are encouraged to do progress into a leader role, nobody who's currently an assistant leader will lose their role. Assistant leaders who have done modules 1–3 of the LQ and would like to move into a leader role can complete the top up course on the learning platform, under the leader development programme. The top-up learning is also a refresher course for any existing leaders who want to refresh their knowledge. However, if a commissioner doubts a person's ability to be a unit leader, this needs to be managed in line with the managing concerns about adult volunteers policy and procedure. A commissioner needs to consider whether that person needs additional support, training or if reasonable adjustments, this should be made in line with equality, diversity and inclusion policy.

Moving sections

If you've qualified as a leader via the old leadership qualification (Red Book), you can do the <u>moving sections course</u> on the learning platform, under the leader development programme. This course is for leaders who competed the old leadership qualification, have been actively volunteering, and now want to volunteer with a different section than the one they originally qualified with. If you've completed the leader development programme to become a leader, there isn't a section specific area of learning.


