### Message from the County Commissioner



During the summer I received a number of emails regarding members safe space needing renewing. Please check your record via GO also have a look at your emails via my communications. Girlguiding Central Glamorgan appreciates every person who supports Girlguiding but it is impossible with over 300 adult volunteer to remind everyone personally.

All units need to have a person with a current First Aid Qualification. Good practice would be that more than one member in the unit has this qualification so as to allow flexible Guiding and that the unit is always covered. **The next First Response training is 17<sup>th</sup> November at Porthcawl Guide Hall**. If you have recognised prior learning or external course on first aid this will need to be verified through the <u>external first aid area of the learning platform</u>. This will be verified by your region first aid verifier team. You'll still need to complete the 1st response e-learning before you're able to upload your external course for verification. You'll be asked to provide your certificate as well as information regarding how your external course has covered the <u>1st response syllabus</u>.

DBS – these must be current and they are part of the recruitment check process. Please contact your Commissioner if a DBS is required for any member of a unit.

GO should also be up to date to help you manage your unit easier and also at county, region and Girlguiding UK HQ level to see where help is needed. The data from GO is used by Girlguiding HQ to inform the decisions they make, especially around recruitment campaigns and funding so it is important to maintain good records.


